CHICKASAW COUNCIL HOUSE MUSEUM

The first Chickasaw Capitol House built in Indian Territory is preserved inside this museum along with a beautiful collection of pottery, jewelry, beadwork, artifacts, Chickasaw artwork and archives. The Chickasaw Council House Museum is located on Capitol Square in Tishomingo next to the Chickasaw National Capitol. Group guided tours of the museum are available, however reservations are required.

CHICKASAW NATIONAL CAPITOL

In April 1898, construction began on the Chickasaw National Capitol. This Victorian, gothic-style structure is more than 8,000 square feet and was built of red granite from the Pennington Creek quarry of Gov. R. M. Harris. Horses and mules pulled granite blocks weighing 175 lbs. per cubic foot to the Capitol grounds. Today, the Chickasaw National Capitol serves as a museum and reminder that the Chickasaw people fought for their tribal identity and independence. Reservations are required for groups planning to visit the Chickasaw National Capitol, and guided tours are available upon request.

THE CHISHOLM TRAIL HERITAGE CENTER

Named after trader Jesse Chisholm, you can learn all about the iconic trail at the Chisholm Trail Heritage Center in Duncan. Professional tour guides get you started on your adventure throughout the museum. The 4D Experience Theater offers a multi-sensory adventure "on the trail," where you can smell the wildflowers of the Oklahoma prairie in the springtime and watch a stampede in a thunderstorm. A visit to the Campfire Theater will have you eavesdropping on Jesse Chisholm and Cowboy Tex. Visitors can rope a longhorn steer, ride a bronco or create their own brand at the Branding Station. An exceptional collection of Western paintings and sculptures can be found in the Garis Gallery of the American West, where groups can learn more about the artists and their artwork through a self-guided tour.

CHICKASAW WHITE HOUSE

Once considered a mansion on the great frontier, this Victorian-style home served as the private residence of Chickasaw Governor Douglas H. Johnston and his family. Built in 1898, this historic home was the setting for many important social and political events including high-profile weddings and meetings between prominent politicians and members of the Dawes Commission. The home features cherry fireplace mantels, crystal chandeliers and 14-foot ceilings, with many original furnishings and décor remaining intact today. A multitude of fine art and musical instruments can be found within the home, acting as a testament to the Chickasaw Nation's dedication to education in all fields. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the house now operates as a museum, and groups are welcome.

TOY AND ACTION FIGURE MUSEUM





The Toy and Action Figure Museum opened its doors in 2005 and has since been recognized as one of Time Magazine's 'Top 50 Most Authentic American Experiences.' It has made Pauls Valley, a destination city as the world's first museum devoted to the art and sculpting of action figures. Groups can browse through the informational exhibits and colorful displays while reminiscing on childhood memories of their favorite action figures. The Oklahoma Cartoonists Collection features published artists and writers from Oklahoma who were involved with popular characters such as Dick Tracy. More than 10,000 action figures cover every inch of the "Collector's Bedroom" diorama with toys added each week to ensure there's always something new to see at the Toy and Action Figure Museum!

This national park is a beautiful oasis of water, foliage and wildlife creating the perfect backdrop for all your favorite outdoor activities. Located in Sulphur, the park offers year-round activities such as boating, skiing, fishing, swimming, hiking and camping. The Chickasaw National Recreation Area provides more than 30 miles of trails for novice and experienced hikers. The Travertine Nature Center serves as the park's main educational center providing groups with interactive learning opportunities, informational exhibits and other Ranger-led programs, including guided hikes and educational tours on the flora and fauna found within the park.

TURNER FALLS PARK

Nestled within the Arbuckle Mountains, Turner Falls Park is the oldest park in Oklahoma complete with natural caves, hiking trails, a stone castle and a 77-foot waterfall, creating natural swimming pools for all to enjoy. Discovered by Mazeppa Thomas Turner in 1878, Turner Falls is considered one of the three great geological views of the nation's past along with the Grand Canyon and Black Hills of South Dakota.

CHICKASAW BANK MUSEUM

The Bank of the Chickasaw Nation opened in 1901 and came to ruin in 1909 when a cashier and part owner absconded with the money (around \$40,000) and was never caught or brought to justice. Years later, the first floor was restored to its original appearance as the Chickasaw Nation's official depository showcasing historical memorabilia and artifacts. The Chickasaw Bank Museum was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1992 and has since become a popular stop for group tours around the area.

FORT WASHITA HISTORIC SITE & MUSEUM

Fort Washita was built in 1842 and served as a former United States military post in Durant. The mission of Fort Washita was to protect the Chickasaw and Choctaw tribes from the Plains Indians and was abandoned after the Civil War in 1865. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, Fort Washita has become a popular point of interest for groups to journey into the past through informational exhibits, Civil War
